AUGUST MEETING WAS AN UNDERWATER DELIGHT

One of Evansville Bend's favorite speakers, Allen Campbell, brought his underwater slide show back to our meeting for a third time.



Members were not disappointed as Allen's underwater photography was better than ever.

Allen has been diving since 1978 and has made over 1000 dives. He has traveled to all parts of the world to take pictures of the underwater world. His favorite way to visit these sites is to dive and live aboard a boat. This allows him to get in 4 to 5 dives per day. It is more expensive but it's the best way to dive because you are staying in a floating hotel right above where you can dive. Allen has taken 15 of these diving trips aboard these boats.

He uses a wide-angle lens for some of his close-up shots to get the complete subject. His goal is to "make them not look wet" so when people look at the photograph, the subject looks dry as if not taken underwater.

He likes to take photos looking upward in about 30 feet of water with the sunlight filtering through the water. These make for spectacular shots.

It was another great program and we thank Allen for making the drive from Henderson to Hornville.




CANOE TRIP WAS A BIG SUCCESS
